September 25-27, October 2-4 - *The Foreigner* by Larry Shue

What does a shy Englishman in search of rest do when he visits a fishing lodge in Georgia? In Larry Shue's hilarious farce, Charlie Baker, a proof reader by day and a boring husband by night, adopts the persona of a foreigner who doesn't understand English. When others begin to speak freely around him, he not only becomes privy to secrets both dangerous and frivolous, he also discovers an adventurous extrovert within himself.

October 30-November 1, 6-8 – *History of the Roses*, an original play by Lowell Williams

The play takes place simultaneously in the 1990's and the 1920's. Sarah, the wife of a rich New York businessman Colin Wescott, has come to Portsmouth, NH, to oversee reconstruction of a large summer residence her husband has purchased. The story of Sarah's unhappy marriage leads to an affair and a mystery that is unraveled some 70 years later. The play was inspired by the Langdon House in Portsmouth.

February 5-7, 12-14 – *The Miracle Worker* by William Gibson

The true story of Helen Keller and Annie Sullivan, a gripping battle to overcome impossible obstacles and the struggle to communicate. As a young girl, Helen Keller is stricken with scarlet fever. The illness leaves her blind, mute, and deaf. Sealed off from the world, Helen cannot communicate with anyone, nor anyone with her. The gifted teacher Annie Sullivan is summoned by the family to help the girl understand the world from which she is isolated, freeing Helen Keller from her internal prison forever.

March 19-21, 26-28 – *Over the River & Through the Woods* by Joe DiPietro, the author of *I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change*.

Recently an Off-Broadway success, an utterly charming play about a young man dealing with his two sets of overbearing grandparents - is witty and poignant, and addresses issues of family relationships with a satisfying, old-fashioned point of view.

May 14-16, 21-23 – *The Importance of Being Earnest* by Oscar Wilde.

The classic funny and masterful send-up of Victorian manners, especially in regards to marriage and morality.

December 11-13, 18-20 – *Not on This Night* by Evelyn Jones

This absorbing and poignant play gives today's teens a glimpse of their counterparts back in World War II, while it evokes memories for older audience members. The setting is 1944, and the Battle of the Bulge rages near the French border. Alone on Christmas Eve, 18 year old Jacqueline is startled by the sudden appearance of two lost soldiers, one German and the other American, who confront each other in her farmhouse kitchen. Violence is averted by the plucky teenager's determination and goodwill, and the humanity of the desperate young soldiers emerges in a lively and nostalgic celebration scene.
